COACH TB THOMAS SPORTS CENTER

- Two bicycles, an Ab Coaster machine, and core strengthening station has been added to the Fitness Center.
- Youth volleyball program began in September.
- Church volleyball will continue in the TB Thomas gymnasium through October.
- Conference Room has served as training location for HPD Reserve Officer trainings.

BYERLY PARK

- The fields at Byerly Park are busy with cheerleading, flag football, tackle football programs underway.
- Girls softball league has been cancelled and refunds are being processed.
- Adult co-ed softball season has begun and all games are on Complex 1.
- Replaced warped tiles on 2 playground areas (closest to Splash Pad building and tennis courts) and replaced with ADA approved cypress chips. Playground area with KipKruz had old Engineered Wood Fiber chips taken out and replaced with new cypress chips
- Replaced broken ZipKruz trolley with brand new, updated trolley.
- Irrigation leaks on soccer and football fields were fixed
- Hosted Bayler Baseball tournament September 10-11 with 70 participating teams.
- Faith Howle and Debra Walters attended a turf training in Columbia and look forward to improving the grass at Byerly Park.

LAWTON PARK

- Coordinated 8 rentals and 10 tours.
- Two weekends remain for 2016 with dates being secured for 2017.
- Interior of building will be painted starting next month and kick plates installed.
- Green, powder coated player benches have been added to each tennis court.
- Rock walkway between tennis courts has been dug up and new sod has been put down in its place. This will eliminate rocks on the courts and in the grass and also provides a sturdier walking area.
- The tennis backboard will be repainted and will feature a tennis net line on the board to simulate the height of the tennis net.
- Water fountain has been installed (by Streets & Grounds crew) next to playground restroom.
