More than 1,000 Hartsville High alumni, friends and family spanning more than five decades are expected to descend on Hartsville's Byerly Park for a multiyear class reunion April 16 beginning at 4 p.m.

The event, called "Go Big or Go Home," is the result of a small gettogether gone viral, as last year 615 people invaded Hartsville for the first "Go Big, or Go Home" (GBOGH) reunion. in April.

Event organizer Scott Galloway (Hartsville High class of 1979) explained the event began as a way to bring old friends together, "We thought we'd have 30 or 40 people show up last year, but evidently we hit a nerve because over 600 attended. We're showcasing Hartsville talent again this year, and after expenses are paid, all remaining dollars will go towards kickstart funding for any HHS class organizing a reunion effort. We hope Go Big or Go Home will be the big annual party that helps create other parties."

Headlining the event is Atlas Road Crew led by Hartsville native Taylor Nicholson, and son of Danny Nicholson '80. Hartsville native to perform with Atlas Road Crew at HHS reunion on Saturday

Former Hartsville native, Taylor Nicholson will be back in his hometown this weekend performing with the band Atlas Road Crew for the "Go Big or Go Home" reunion at Byerly Park. The multi-class Hartsville High reunion begins at 4 p.m. All alumni, family and friends are invited.

"Anyone who is a Red Fox at heart is invited," said a member of the committee working on the event.

"We're showcasing Hartsville Talent again this year," said Scott Galloway, HHS Class of 1979, who spearheads the organizing group called Homecoming Ninjas.



Atlas Road Crew for which Nicholson is lead vocalist is quickly gathering fans all over the East Coast.

Ten years ago, Nicholson moved from Hartsville with his parents, Debra and Danny Nicholson, to Mt. Pleasant. He graduated from high school in Pawleys Island.

As a student at the University of South Carolina, he and several of his buddies began playing music together for fun and in 2011 formed a band. He said they started playing shows in the Columbia area and their popularity has continued to grow.

Nicholson said they took their name from the name of a Columbia road near where they first began to practicing in an old warehouse.

The group describes itself as "South Carolina rock 'n' roll shot with southern soul accents."

Members of the band are: Nicholson of Pawleys Island, guitar; Patrick Drohan of Great Falls, Virginia, drums; Max Becker of Mount Pleasant, bass guitar; Dave Beddingfield of Charlotte, North Carolina, guitar; and Bryce James of Columbia, piano.

According to their bio, "Atlas Road Crew is rapidly building one of the most loyal fan bases on the East Coast, packing venues to capacity from South Carolina to New York City, and expanding quickly to major US cities in between.

"The overwhelming positive response to the band's latest recorded effort Halfway to Hopkins, produced by Grammy Award winning producer Rick Beato, has this young band quickly becoming the South East's 'must see' live act of 2015."

"Halfway to Hopkins is a sonic blast from start to finish, bringing swampy southern accents to fresh, contemporary tunes while managing to capture the band's blistering live show prowess on tape," says Drohan.

The title refers to a small community outside Columbia where the band lived for several years after graduating from the nearby University of South Carolina.


"That house, which was halfway between Columbia and Hopkins on the southeast side of town, was where we really began to come together," Drohan said. "We knew then we wanted to become more than just another bar band."

Nicholson said the group just finished a European Tour that began in late January and ended on March 7.

"We played 35 shows in 30 days," Nicholson said.

Drohan said, "Aussie rock 'n' roll blog 100 Percent Rock sums it all up nicely in their review, saying in no uncertain terms 'This is EXACTLY the sort of music we should be listening to right now: bands taking old favourites and adding new directions, writing great songs, delivering ace performances. This is the good stuff."

Most recently the group opened for Hootie and the Blowfish in Charleston.



"We hope to start working on our second album in June or July," Nicholson said.

"I am very excited to get back," he said. Although he says there are very few people that he remembers still live in Hartsville, except for family.

"My dad was raised in Hartsville and graduated from Hartsville High School. My grandmother, Mary Nicholson, still lives in Hartsville," he said.

In addition to Atlas Road Crew, the reunion will feature Scott Summers, Class of 1979, as master of ceremonies. Others Hartsville High alumni on the program will be Kendall Lee Skinner, class of 2006; AJ Sanders, class of 2007; and Brooks Shumake, class of 1981. DJ Deese will also be there.

Tickets are \$10 per person.

Galloway said this is more than a Hartsville High class reunion.

"This is a Hartsville community reunion. If you've got a Hartsville connection, we hope you will join us."

After expenses are paid, all remaining dollars will be used as "seed money" for next year's event, he said.

"We hope 'Go Big or Go Home' will be the big annual party that helps creates other parties," Galloway said.


They're creepy and they're kooky...

'Go Big or Go Home' turns into town reunion for Hartsville

Brooks Shumake will be performing at the second annual 'Go Big or Go Home' event in Hartsville.

HARTSVILLE, S.C. - Go Big or Go Home began as a group of old high school friends reuniting in Hartsville.

But with the help of social media, it quickly shifted from a 30- or 40-person gathering at J. Michael's to a block party with more than 600 in attendance.

"When we started this we had absolutely no intention of it turning into what it did," said Scott Galloway, event organizer and 1979 graduate of Hartsville High School.



As it picked up steam, Galloway and his friends decided to step back and let the party blossom.

"We were just crazy enough last year just to not get in the party's way," he said.

Now in its second year, Go Big or Go Home will be held from 4 p.m. to midnight Saturday at Byerly Park in Hartsville.

"It's a town reunion. Not just one class, it's everybody," Galloway said. "If you've got a Hartsville connection, you're invited."


This year's event will feature four musical acts, all of whom have Hartsville connections.

Kendall Lee Skinner, a 2006 Hartsville High School graduate, will open the show. A.J. Sanders, a 2007 graduate, will follow Skinner. Brooks Shumake, a 1981 graduate, will perform with his band in the third slot.

Atlas Road Crew, a band formed in Columbia but currently located in Charleston, will close out the night as the event headliner.

Taylor Nicholson, the band's lead singer, grew up in Hartsville for the first 10 years of his life. His dad, Danny Nicholson, graduated from Hartsville High School in 1980.

"It's good to get back," Nicholson said. "It will be my grandmother's first time to ever hear us play."



The band just returned from a European tour, where Nicholson said they played 35 shows in 40 days.

"We were very busy," he said, chuckling. "...But it was a great learning experience. We were well-received over there."

Atlas Road Crew, known for their Southern soul, rock 'n' roll flavor, will likely play a majority of the songs off the group's first studio album, "Halfway to Hopkins."

Galloway said there will be a DJ playing between each of the live music sets and a huge floor for dancing.

Guests are encouraged to bring chairs, blankets and sunscreen. Because of a city regulation, no coolers or alcohol will be allowed into Byerly Park. The concession stand will be open for food and drinks, and Vintage Craft Beer and Wine Boutique will be on site to sell beer and wine.

A \$10 admission fee will be charged. Galloway and his team plan to use the proceeds to cover the event expenses. Any remaining money will be put into a fund to help kickstart other reunions thrown by Hartsville High School alumni.

"It's the party that keeps on giving. We hope that Go Big or Go Home will be an annual hometown reunion, a big party every year," he said. "And we hope that it will raise money to help fund smaller groups."
