November Projects/Events Update:

November was a whirlwind month for Main Street Hartsville as it brought back events to our Downtown. While these events did provide a small sense of normalcy, it was very clear that COVID-19 was in the minds of event attendees as they masked up and social distanced from one another when possible.

Hartsville Farmers Market: Main Street Hartsville hosted its first "normal" Farmers Market of 2020 in which vendors were allowed to set up booths along Carolina Avenue to welcome attendees as they walked through Downtown. A total of 18 vendors participated and attendance was estimated to be around 300. Vendors were pleased with the market and thankful to be back in Downtown Hartsville.

Downtown Holiday Open House: A collaborative effort between the Tourism and Events Department, Main Street Hartsville, and the Hartsville for the Holidays staff committee produced a wonderful Downtown Holiday Open House for Downtown Hartsville. The year 2020 brought about change for the event, but the change seemed to be well received by attendees and merchants. The streets were closed down for this event to allow attendees to wander from business to business safely as more room was allowed for social distancing. Vendors and bright lights were placed at the ends of each street to encourage shoppers to walk the entirety of the Downtown blocks and visit each store. Terence Lonon and the Untouchables entertained guests on the Main event stage to provide a wonderful array of musical ambiance to the event. Attendees were found dancing in the street and enjoying their time downtown. Staff received glowing reviews from the public wishing that the street closure for this event could be a permanent change.
