#### Resiliency and the Impacts of COVID-19

Chairman Lee's definition of resilience was the ability to absorb unexpected circumstances. He said that COVID-19 was a black swan event. He stated that we have a strong community that works together and are not pulled apart under stress. In advance of the meeting, staff provided articles about the impacts of COVID-19. Chairman Lee informed the planning commission that the mayor is trying to pull together a network of people to disseminate information. The planning commission is an important part of that network. The immediate things in the COVID crisis include potential changes to regulations in ordinances. The social distancing that is required in an effort to stop to the spread of COVID-19 is contrary to urban planning. Chairman Lee then gave each commissioner and staff an opportunity to provide comments. No action was taken.
