Windows will be installed on the west elevation. The structural engineer said the skeleton of the building is in good shape. The partners would like to keep the 1955 fabric feel. Gandy asked if the roof would remain the same. Tochiki said yes. It will be sprayed with foam. Walden asked if the deck would be treated wood. Tochiki said for seasonal purposes he would like the wood to be aged and weathered opposed to stained. The proposal did not include signage. Goodson made a motion to approve the proposal as presented with the Sherwin William's color 7591 Redbarn and white trim. Second: Walden; Wingfield recused himself from the vote because of the potential of being awarded the project. Carried: Gandy and Tuten in favor.

New Business

Subdivision Plat - Corner of Green Street and Oak Avenue

Michael Henderson (not present) submitted a plat that would subdivide and increase an approximately .42 acre tract. Three (3) parcels would be affected. Tract 1 as shown on the plat would be reduced. Lot 2 and Lott 3 as shown on the plat would be increased. The property is in an R-1 zoning district, which requires a minimum lot area of 10,000 square feet and a minimum lot width of 80 feet. The three (3) lots meet the requirements. Chris Shirley made a motion to approve the subdivision as submitted. Second: R. McDonald; Carried: All in favor.

Subdivision Plat - Corner of South Fourth Street and Westfield Street

Ben Whetstone of Whetstone Associates (not present) submitted a plat to create an outparcel in front of the current Big Lots property at 139 Westfield Street. The property is located in a B-3 zoning district, which requires a minimum lot area of 5,000 square feet and a minimum lot width of 50 feet. The lot meets the requirements. Staff liaison Kelley asked Mr. William Sherrod about the access. SCDOT did not approve a curb cut on South Fourth Street. Mr. Sherrod said a cross-access easement agreement is being drafted. Currently both properties would be owned by the Shops at Hartsville, LLC. They can grant themselves an easement. However, staff was concerned about what happens if either property is sold. Nancy McGee made a motion to approve the plat contingent upon a copy of the cross-access easement agreement when it is available. Second: R. McDonald: Carried: All in favor.

Preliminary Site Development Review – Shops at Hartsville LLC

Staff liaison Kelley stated that staff met with the engineer earlier that afternoon to review the site development plan. She presented a copy of written comments regarding water, sewer, and/or stormwater. The fire department had no issues that needed to be addressed. During the meeting with the engineer, staff liaison Kelley stated that the trees along the street frontage could not be disturbed, a site lighting plan was required, may need an additional handicapped parking space, a cross access agreement was needed, need to verify the building setback. Russell Slatton approved the location of the dumpster enclosure during the earlier meeting. Staff liaison Kelley to check with the building official on the size of the grease trap. Rebecca McDonald made a motion to grant preliminary site development approval. Nancy McGee seconded.

1. Budget 2019-2020 Revenues

Finance Director Caulder presented preliminary general fund budget reporting that \$400K shortfall at this point in the budgeting process. The committee reviewed in depth the individual revenue line items. Estimates of Darlington County tax receipts have not been received. Reassessment year, so there is a likelihood of increased revenues. SRO revenue was increased to cover actual cost. Utility fund transfer based on Raftelis Rate Study from 1.1M to 1.2M. Budgets for Accommodation and Hospitality tax will remain flat with no anticipated increases. Business License rates updated this year based on NAICS codes with a budgeted increase. Building Permits expected to be flat. Discussion about the Parks and Rec revenue. FEMA revenue not expected in the budget. Finance will continue review of revenues to find potential increases.

2. Budget 2019-2020 Expenditures

Finance Director Caulder reported on the increases in payroll related benefits Workers Compensation, Health Insurance, Pension Funding an increase of \$180K. The Committee focused on the two areas that had the largest increases in expenditures Police and Fire and Capital purchases. Continue review to find potential expense decreases to close the budget gap.

DISCUSSIONS

1. Budget 2019-2020 Revenues

Finance Director Caulder presented, sanitation, storm water, water/sewer utility including waterpark, budgets. She also reported that the general fund budget gap of \$400K has been reduced to \$15K. Water/Sewer Utility fund revenues are based on the Raftelis rate study water rents increased by \$235K or 11.6% and sewer rents increased by \$131K or 5.7%. Discussion of current commercial rates for sanitation and way to increase revenues to offset the rising expenditures and a loss of \$15K. Waterpark budget is expected to break even. Further discussion about strategies to increase traffic to waterpark with promotions, improvements in food service and new retail items.

2. Budget 2019-2020 Expenditures

Finance Director Caulder reported on the increases in payroll related benefits Workers Compensation, Health Insurance, Pension Funding an increase of \$200K or 12% for storm water, sanitation, and water/sewer utility including waterpark budgets. Utility fund capital will be funded by accumulated surplus and grant match of \$354 for projects totaling \$1.7M. Sanitation fund capital expenditures for refurbishment of a garbage truck will be offset by a capital lease. Director Caulder reported that Waterpark temporary personnel will be handled in house and will result in cost savings.

3. Adjourned at 11:40 p.m.

January 2019: The Planning Commission met on January 28th to review the Alta Planning & Design Ordinance suggested changes. At this meeting, no action was taken so these ordinances will be further reviewed at February's Planning Commission meeting.

February 2019: The Planning Commission did not have a quorum for the February 25th meeting.

March 2019: The Planning Commission discussed and voted to allow staff to present a creative approach to the city's Sign Regulations Ordinance revision and present the updates at the May Planning Commission meeting.

April 2019: Due to several subdivisions of lots, the ordinance revision was not placed on the agenda. It will pick back up on the May agenda.

Historic Butler District Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy

Staff will set up a meeting in June to see how the City of Hartsville may assist the district in potential projects for 2019/2020.





The Hartsville Police department employs 36 sworn positions, 3 civilians, and 8 crossing guards



Spring and Summer 2018 showed a marked increase in citations, however fall and winter showed the usual slump. May showed our highest rates of ticket issuance for the previous 12 months. Hurricanes had a drastic impact on citations in September and October. Officers were involved with Hurricane preparation and flood mitigation, and wrote fewer tickets. January and March showed an increase with a February and April slump



March had a huge spike in arrests, due in large part to Operation Spring Freeze. April-June had shown a gradual drop towards average, with a large percentage of offenders being from outside the City limits. October had a marked decrease in arrests, however Arrests began returning to more of a normal level. Although November to December showed a slight decrease, there was not as much as an arrest slump as there was a citation slump. January through April has showed an overall decrease in arrests.

Arrestees and Victims

On average, between 50-65% of arrested persons come from outside the city limits, showing that we serve many more people than our in-town population.

In April there were 143 arrests, including 5 Juveniles.

Crime Types

Arrests consisted of the following: (Major categories, not inclusive of all arrests):

Shopliftings – 34 (77% from outside city)
Assaults – 8 (75% from outside city)
Burglary - 2 (50% from outside city)
Thefts - 7 (86% from outside city)
Forgery/Fraud – 11 (36% from outside city)
Drug Offenses – 24 (71% from outside city)
DUI/Drunkeness- 10 (40% from outside city)
Weapons Violations- 7 (71% from outside city)

Totals for all arrests (including those not listed above) 94 of 143 people arrested (66%) live outside the city limits.

LEASE AGREEMENT 2019- 2020

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered by and between THE CITY OF HARTSVILLE, hereafter the LANDLORD, as owner of the leasehold property described and identified here below, and DARLINGTON COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY, hereafter the TENANT.

WITNESSETH:

LEASEHOLD PROPERTY: The LANDLORD agrees to lease unto the TENANT the Office Building located at 149 West Carolina Ave. The said building is located in the City of Hartsville, County of Darlington, and State of South Carolina.

PARKING: TENANT'S employees, agents, and contractors shall have the right to park on the gravel and asphalt areas behind the leasehold property which are not reserved for other businesses. The LANDLORD may specify parking to be used by the TENANT in the future.

TERM OF LEASE: This lease shall run for a period of one (1) year, from the 1st day of May, 2019, to the 30th day of April, 2020.

RENTAL PAYMENTS: TENANT agrees to pay monthly amounts of five hundred dollars (\$500) rent for the said leasehold premises due on the first day of each month. In the event such payment is not made within ten (10) days after it is due, the TENANT shall pay the LANDLORD a late charge of \$100.00.

OTHER CONSIDERATION: TENANT agrees to pay any ad valorem property taxes related to the leasehold premises during the term of this lease or any extensions hereof which the LANDLORD may be held responsible for.

FORFEITURE: not withstanding the foregoing, if any monthly payment is more than thirty (30) days late, the LANDLORD shall have the option to declare all the TENANT'S rights hereunder forfeited, and the LANDLORD, may proceed without notice to eject the TENANT and enforce the collection of rents that are in arrears in any manner provided by law, together with all costs and attorney's fees incurred by the LANDLORD in so doing.

LIEN CREATED IN FAVOR OF LANDLORD: TENANT stipulates and covenants that all property, motor vehicles, goods, and merchandise and all other property placed in and upon the rental premises is owned by the TENANT in its own right, and shall become subject to the statutory lien for unpaid rents, arrearages, and late rent payments.

ALTERATIONS TO LEASEHOLD PROPERTY: TENANT shall not be permitted to make any changes to the leasehold property without advance written approval from the LANDLORD and all such changes to the leasehold premises shall become the property of the LANDLORD.

RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

TENANT shall be responsible for the payment of any utility bills related to the TENANT'S occupancy and use of the leasehold premises.

TENANT shall be responsible for any damages done on the premises either by the TENANT, its agents, servants, or employees, and the TENANT shall, at TENANT'S own expense, make all repairs of such damage.

TENANT shall surrender the leasehold property back to the LANDLORD at the end of the term of this lease agreement in broom clean, good order and condition, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

LANDLORD shall not be responsible to the TENANT, its agents, servants, or employees for any damages which may be caused by water, storm, sleet, snow or for any other damages whatsoever in any manner caused by the occupancy of the said leasehold premises.

TENANT shall be responsible to maintain renter's insurance during the term of this agreement and any extensions thereof, including casualty or theft insurance, on all personal property which the TENANT maintains within the leasehold premises.

TENANT shall, at TENANT'S expense, obtain and maintain in force for the mutual benefit of TENANT and the LANDLORD a commercial general liability insurance policy with a combined minimum limit of \$1,000,000.00.

LANDLORD shall maintain casualty insurance coverage on the improvements on the leasehold premises to protect the LANDLORD'S interest, but LANDLORD shall not be responsible for any loss of the TENANT'S personal property through casualty or theft during the occupancy of the premises.

TENANT SHALL HOLD LANDLORD HARMLESS. Notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement, the TENANT agrees to hold the LANDLORD harmless from any and all claims for damages or injuries that may be made against the LANDLORD arising from the TENANT'S use of the leasehold premises during the term of this lease or any extensions hereof.

PEACEFUL OCCUPATION OF LEASEHOLD PREMISES. Subject to the other conditions of this agreement, LANDLORD guarantees TENANT'S peaceful occupation of the leasehold premises during the term of this agreement or any extensions thereof, PROVIDED HOWEVER, the LANDLORD shall have the right to enter the leasehold premises for the purpose of viewing the premises to see that no waste or damage is being committed and for purposes of showing the leasehold premises to prospective purchasers.

LEASE NOT ASSIGNABLE. This lease is not assignable and the TENANT shall not sublet any portion of the leasehold premises without the written consent of the LANDLORD.

EARLY TERMINATION OF LEASE. The TENANT shall opt out of this lease agreement with six (6) months advanced written notice to LANDLORD.

RECITALS. This lease agreement supersedes all prior written or oral agreements and can be amended only through a written agreement signed by both parties; this lease agreement is entered into for good and valuable consideration, which the parties hereby acknowledge; this lease agreement is binding upon both parties, their successors and assigns; and this lease agreement is entered by the parties of their own free will and accord.

ORDINANCE 4366

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT A BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF HARTSVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2019, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2020.

WHEREAS, Section 5-7-260 of the South Carolina Code of Laws (as amended) requires that a Municipal Council shall act by ordinance to adopt budgets and levy taxes pursuant to public notice; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hartsville has duly conducted its yearly budget process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hartsville that the City's budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 is hereby adopted as follows:

Section 1

- (a) There is hereby adopted a General Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$10,293,878.
- (b) Further, there is hereby adopted a Water, Sewer, and Waterpark Enterprise Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$6,662,259.
- (c) Further, there is hereby adopted an Infrastructure Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$521,000.
- (d) Further, there is hereby adopted a Solid Waste Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020 as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$1,499,290.
- (e) Further, there is hereby adopted a Hospitality Fee Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$995,500.
- (f) Further, there is hereby adopted an Accommodations Tax Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$200,000.

- (g) Further, there is hereby adopted a Debt Service Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$165,000.
- (h) Further, there is hereby adopted a Storm Water Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$122,354.
- (i) Further, there is hereby adopted a Recreations Concessions Fund budget for the City of Hartsville for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as filed in the office of the City Clerk which is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein, providing for revenues and appropriations in a total amount of \$65,000.

Section 2

- (A) Subject to the provisions and requirements of Section 6-1-320 of the South Carolina Code of Laws (as amended), a tax for general operating purposes for the period from July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, for the sums and in the amount hereinafter mentioned, is and shall be levied, collected and paid into the treasury of the City of Hartsville for the operational use and service thereof. A tax of one hundred thirty-seven and ninety-six hundredths (137.96) mils upon each one thousand (\$1,000) in value of real estate and personal property of every description owned and used in the City of Hartsville, South Carolina, is and shall be levied and paid into the City treasury for the credit to the General Fund of the City of Hartsville for the corporate purposes, improvements, and for the purpose of paying current operating expenses of said municipality. Such a tax is levied on such property as is assessed for taxation for County and State purposes.
- (B) A tax necessary to pay the debt service on the City's general obligation bonds for the period from July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, for the sums required in Section 1(j) above, is and shall be levied and collected by the Auditor and Treasurer, respectively, and shall be paid by the Treasurer into the treasury of the City or for the benefit of the City as required by the borrowing documents related to the City's general obligation bonds for the payment of the City's general obligation bonds. A tax of six (6) mils shall be levied upon all taxable real and personal property of every description owned and used in the City. Such tax is and shall be levied, collected and paid in accordance with the borrowing documents related to the City's general obligation bonds.

Section 3

The budget of the Water, Sewer, and Waterpark Enterprise Fund incorporates the scheduled utility rates as prescribed in Ordinance 4377 dated June 28, 2018.

Section 4

The budget of the Solid Waste Enterprise Fund incorporates the scheduled commercial rates as prescribed in Ordinance 4365 dated June 11, 2019 and the scheduled residential rates as prescribed in Ordinance 4271 dated October 11, 2016.

Section 5

The City Manager shall administer the budget and may authorize the transfer of appropriate funds within and between departments as necessary to achieve the goals of the budget.

Section 6

If for any reason, any sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid, such shall not affect the remaining provisions thereof.

Section 7

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance	are
hereby repealed, insofar as the same affect this Ordinance.

This resolution is needed since Main Street is under the city now and to help streamline the permitting process so that vendors are not being charged twice.

IMPACT IF DENIED:

Each vendor would still be required to obtain both a vendor permit and business license permit to participate in Main Street events other than the Farmers Market.

IMPACT IF APPROVED:

The vendor process for participating in Main Street events will become easier and this will help spur vendor participation.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

An increase in Main Street permitting events should occur to help offset a decrease in business license revenue. Vendors participating in multiple events would have the option of obtaining a business license and would still pay a reduced Main Street permit fee.
