

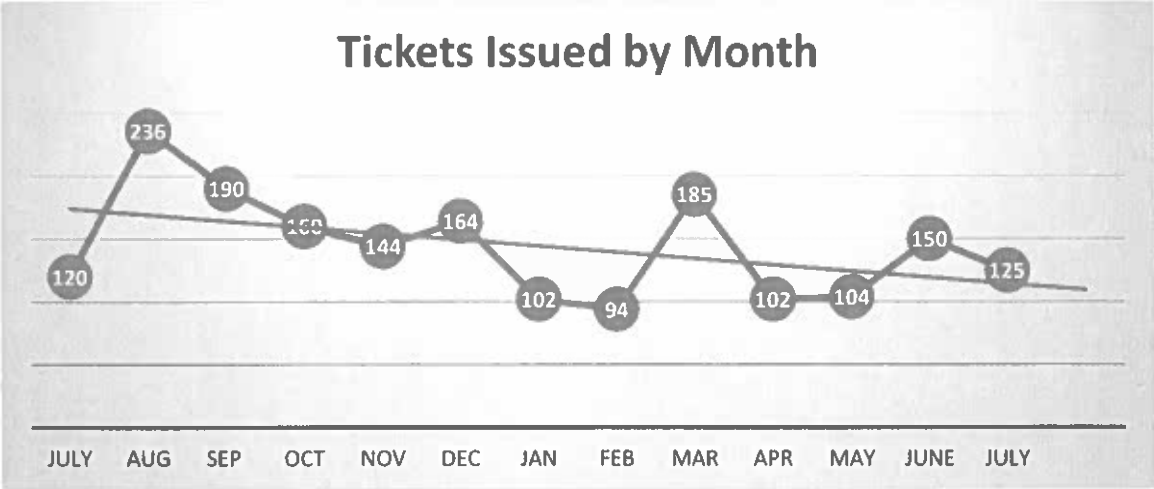

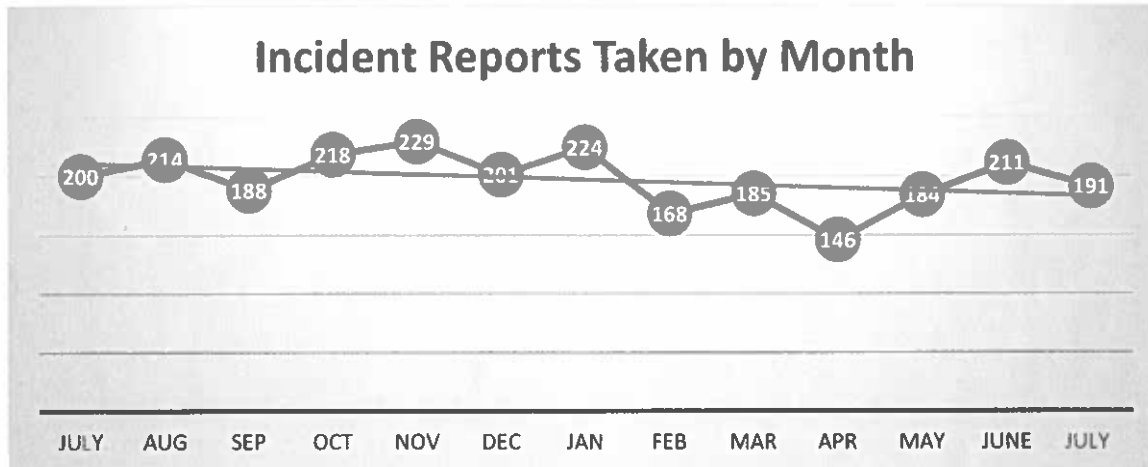

July 2023 showed a small decline in citations issued for the month. The number of citations issued is consistent with July 2022. However, with the implementation of the CRU, and officer numbers increasing, citations issued should remain steady and possibly increase in the months to come.



Arrest in July 2023 showed a small decline from the previous month. The lowest total year to date is April 2023 with 59 arrest and the highest total year to date is November 2022 with 135 arrest. With the exception of those two months, arrest have remained around 100 a month for the past year. With the CRU and officer numbers increasing, I predict arrest will show a steady increase in the months to come.



Incident Reports taken are a reflection of reports actually written. A report is not written for every call. Reports taken seem to fluctuate around an average of about 175 per month, with a slight decrease over the previous 12 months. This is incident reports only, accidents are not included in this data.

Arrestees and Victims

On average, between 60-65% of arrested persons come from outside the city limits, showing that we serve many more people than our in-town population.

July gave us 97 arrests, including 13 Juveniles (mostly property offenses).

Crime Types

Arrests consisted of the following: (Major categories, not inclusive of all arrests):

Burglary	0	(0% from outside City)
Assaults	5	(83% from outside City)
Thefts	17	(35% from outside City)
Shopliftings	4	(100% from outside City)
Forgery/Fraud	0	(0% from outside City)
Drug Offenses	26	(77% from outside City)
DUI/Drunkenness	14	(79% from outside City)
Non-Reported State	19	(95% from outside City)*

*Non-Reported to State offenses are generally offenses like Driving Under Suspension, Operating Uninsured, Possession of Controlled Substance, and other crimes that are outside the typical violent/property crime classifications

Totals for all arrests (including those not listed above)
66 of 97 people arrested (68%) live outside the city limits.
